## Principal's Message

As the cold weather and snow flurries begin we are reminded about the various safety precautions we have to exercise to keep ourselves safe. I remember as a child being told to never stick my tongue onto a piece of metal that is outside in the winter. As a curious child, I always wanted to know why. One day I stuck my tongue on to the swing set standard at Baker School and found out very quickly why we instill basic safety precautions.

At Correlieu we often remind students to wear proper clothing and footwear in cold weather. Some students don't mind bundling up to keep warm, others still insist on wearing running shoes in 20 degrees below temperatures and in a foot of snow.

This year we will put up a Christmas tree in our foyer by the gymnasium, theatre and cafeteria. The tree will be decorated with warm mitts, gloves, toques, scarves and hats. Students are told that they can take a gift from the tree, or, they can add a gift to the tree.

**Indigenous Suicide Prevention Workshop**  
We want to help to change the mind set before becomes a critical reality. Suicide is a problem that not only affects youth but impacts the whole community. The ripple effect of trauma is powerful in small, close-knit indigenous communities, possibly accounting for suicide clusters. For some, suicide becomes a means of escape when there are few alternative choices available. Suicide prevention generally involves finding ways to reduce risk factors and promoting protective and preventive factors against suicide.
